# GRADES + CREDITS

Below is an outline of how the grades you earn at AHS help you obtain the credits you need to graduate from high school AND get into college...

A grade = You passed! You earned 5 credits toward HS graduation and met college entrance requirements.

**B grade** = You passed! You earned 5 credits toward HS graduation and met college entrance requirements.

**C grade =** You passed! You earned 5 credits toward HS graduation and minimally met college entrance requirements.

**D grade** = You passed and earned 5 credits towards HS graduation, but this grade <u>will not</u> count toward meeting college entrance requirements.

**F grade** = You did not pass and therefore did not earn 5 credits toward HS graduation. <u>You will have to repeat the course.</u>




